## ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

### **ACCESS 2004 – A conference on Partnership in Disability**

In 2004 South Africa will celebrate a decade of democracy – Access 2004 is planned to coincide with these celebrations. The conference program will explore the effect democracy has had on people with disability especially in terms of access to ensure equal participation in and benefit from mainstream society.

Access 2004 will ensure that disability related planning, development and implementation as per the Integrated National Disability Strategy and Integrated Provincial Disability Strategy remain relevant. One of the biggest challenges is still to ensure that disability becomes and remains part of mainstream development, planning and implementation in order to facilitate the natural and unhesitant integration of Disability into society.

The conference is to be held at the Cape Town International Convention Centre from the 30th November to the 2nd December 2004. Relevant presentations and exhibitions complimented by vibrant discussion and debate will be attended by 500 delegates comprising government and decision makers, sector professionals, academics and institutions, the corporate sector and the disabled community.

## ABOUT THE EXHIBITION

The 2nd ACCESS Exhibition will be staged from the 30th November to the 2nd December and will be located in the Cape Town International Convention Centre Exhibition Hall 1.

Designed as a showcase for the sector, it is to include government and private sector information stands detailing improvements in relation to Access and display stands showcasing sector related assistive devices, technology, vehicles, services and facilities.

Delegate exposure to the exhibition will be before and after conference and during refreshment breaks and lunch, which will be hosted in the exhibition area. A networking cocktail reception is also planned to take place in the exhibition area on the opening day

### **Exhibitor Opportunity:**

It is estimated that 10-15% of the South African population either lives with or is in daily contact with disability. The government has highlighted the disabled sector as a specific area in terms of delivery.

Disability is not an onerous employment equity task, shrouded in myth, but rather a significant economic partner with huge potential. This is illustrated by taking figures from overseas examples.

- \* Of the 49 million Americans with Disabilities, who are employed. Earnings total more than \$1 Trillion disposable income of \$250 Billion.
- \* American tourists with disabilities spend \$4.8 Billion annually.

***4.5 – 5 million people with Disabilities in South Africa are becoming aware of their situation; their potential, the barriers facing them and their rights, business would ignore them at their own loss.***

### EXHIBITION VENUE

The conference is to be held at the Cape Town International Convention Centre. The exhibition will be held in the Exhibition Hall 1, ground floor at the Cape Town International Convention Centre.

### EXHIBITION HOURS

The exhibition will be open to delegates at the following times (times are provisional and dependant on final program):

Tuesday 30 November 07h30 – 21h00  
Wednesday 1 December 07h30 – 18h00  
Thursday 2 December 07h30 – 14h30

To maximize attendance in the exhibition area, most morning and afternoon refreshment breaks as well as lunch on all days will be held in the exhibition area. Provisionally a cocktail reception on the first evening is also planned in the exhibition area.

### CHARGES FOR EXHIBITION STANDS

The charges for the two sizes of simple shell scheme are as follows:

#### **UNIT A : R 12,000-00 excluding Vat**

5.0m wide by 4.0m deep. 2x 100W spotlights and 1x 15am plug  
Staff entitlement: 3 personnel badge per stand

#### **UNIT B : R8,000-00 excluding Vat**

3.0m wide by 2.0m deep. 1x 100W spotlights and 1x 15am plug  
Staff entitlement: 2 personnel badge per stand

#### **UNIT C : R5,000-00 excluding Vat (DISABILITY SECTOR NGO ONLY)**

3.0m wide by 2.0m deep. 1x 100W spotlights and 1x 15am plug  
Staff entitlement: 2 personnel badge per stand

#### **The stand charge includes the following:**

Shell scheme; plug point; spotlight; overall security of complex; general illumination; registration of personnel as described; accompanying meals and refreshments as itemized; free listing in conference handbook; free listing on conference website.

The respective charges for stand units A & B include both hire of floor space and provision of a shell scheme which will be automatically supplied unless specified to the contrary. Diagrams showing the dimensions and design of the two types are shown on addendum I of the manual. No discount is available to exhibitors not taking the complimentary shell scheme described.

### **DIMENSIONS OF EXHIBITION STANDS**

2 different sizes of stands are offered to suit the objectives and budgets of all exhibitors. The sizes of the stands are reflected in the types of units, Unit A being the larger and Unit B the smaller. The dimensions of the two units are listed below:

### **ELECTRICS**

The following electrical facilities will be provided as part of the contracted shell scheme:

#### Unit A

- 2 x 100W spot light
- 1 x 15 Amp Single Phase Outlets

#### Unit B

- 1 x 100W spot light
- 1 x 15 Amp Single Phase Outlets

### **SET-UP AND BREAKDOWN**

Exhibitors may commence set up from 11h00 on Monday 29th November. **NB – Exhibition is not open to delegates until 07h30 on Tuesday 30th November.**

All Stand Construction staff must wear company identification badges and T-Shirts for the duration of build up and break-down of exhibitions. From the opening of the exhibition on the morning on Tuesday 30th November, staff will not be admitted into the area without an official Conference Registration badge.

Breakdown may commence ONLY from 14h30 on Thursday 2nd December 2004 and all material must be removed from the Cape Town International Convention Centre by 20h00 of that day.

*NB Items not removed by exhibitors by this time will be disposed of by the organisers at the Exhibitors expense.*

### **BADGES**

Exhibitors will be provided with the following number of badges, which will entitle holders to entrance to all conference sessions and to the exhibition itself.

UNIT A	3 badges
UNIT B & C	2 badges

No refund will be made if any exhibitor does not wish to take up the full entitlement. Badges are transferable and may be requested if so required in the name of the company. Exhibitor badges will be valid for the duration of the exhibition. Additional badges may be purchased at a supplementary cost.

To avoid potential embarrassment and inconvenience, exhibitors are asked to ensure that all personnel are properly registered in advance with the Conference Secretariat. Casual visitors to the Exhibition are not admitted without proper registration. **All Exhibitor badges will be issued only after full payment for exhibition stands has been received.**

### **MEALS AND REFRESHMENTS**

No meals and refreshment are included in the stand rental charges. Various catering facilities are available at the Cape Town International Convention Centre on a cash basis.

### **EXHIBITION SHELL SCHEME**

Stand charges are based on rental of simple 3-sided units. Both unit types are 2.4m high and constructed of 16mm chipboard panels hinged together, painted white. Nails, screws and self-adhesives are permitted for fixing of artwork etc. All units are provided with a fascia (name) beam, painted white with blue lettering. Spotlights are attached to the inside of the fascia beam.

High equipment placed in stand areas must not exceed 3m and must not restrict a clear view of neighbouring exhibits. Any structures of over this height require special consent.

Shell Scheme exhibition stands are low cost stands of simple but attractive design. Those exhibitors wishing to achieve a more elaborate high tech or striking design are encouraged to consider own "designer stands".

### **DESIGNER STANDS**

Exhibitors wishing to construct and display their own stands rather than utilizing the shell scheme provided are required to apply to the Conference Secretariat. Detailed plans are required. Every effort will be made to accommodate such requests and charges will be assessed on a pro-rata basis according to the square meterage occupied.

### **STAND BUILDERS**

All exhibitors engaging stand builders in connection with their exhibits must provide the Secretariat with names and contact details of their appointed stand builders. Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring that their stand builders are made aware of all relevant regulations and requirements contained in this manual.

### **FURNITURE**

### **PAINTING**

No painting, whether by brush, spray or roller is permitted anywhere inside the Cape Town International Convention Centre.

### **CARPETS**

The Exhibition Hall is covered throughout with red and grey checked carpet. Any exhibitor wanting to lay any other form of floor covering on a stand must obtain the approval of the Conference Director. Any damage to the Cape Town International Convention Centre by individual stand holders will be chargeable to individual stand holders.

### **BANNERS**

The hanging of banners is NOT permitted within the exhibition area other than on exhibition stands.

### **CATERING**

The Cape Town International Convention Centre has exclusive catering rights on the property. Any exhibitor wishing to serve food and drink on their stands is invited to make arrangements directly with the Conference Director.

### **EXHIBITOR PUBLICITY**

All exhibitors are invited to submit an electronic version of their corporate logo together with a promotional paragraph (maximum 40 words) for inclusion in the conference handbook. This Handbook will be combined with the conference program and will be given to all delegates at the conference. The information submitted will also be put onto the conference website. This information must be submitted to the Conference Secretariat as soon as possible for website inclusion, but no later than the 22nd October 2004.

### **DELEGATE PACKS**

Each delegate is issued with a conference pack. Exhibitors are invited to include promotional material in these packs at no extra charge. To ensure that your material is included in these packs, it must be made available to the Conference Director no later than 14h00 on Thursday the 25th November and delivered to the Secretariat at 1st Floor, cnr Selous and Lansdowne Roads, Claremont

### **INSURANCE & SECURITY**

The exhibitor acknowledges the layout of the Exhibition area and that the large numbers of people present in the Exhibition Hall make it impossible for adequate security to be provided to protect the Exhibitors merchandise and property.

Accordingly, the Exhibitor assumes all risk of loss for Exhibitors merchandise, displays, and other property of the Exhibitor located in the Exhibition area, storage area, or any other area where access has been provided to Exhibitors by the Organizers where such loss from theft, vandalism, or any other damage caused by any agent or employee of the Organizers or caused by any person either authorized or not authorized to be present at the Exhibition Hall.

Furthermore, the Exhibitor acknowledges that the security guards and storage areas are provided by the Organizers merely as a service, and that the Organizers have made no representation regarding the adequacy of such security measures.

Neither the Cape Town International Convention Centre nor the organisers take any responsibility for loss of or damage to exhibition stand material, equipment and exhibits. Exhibitors are encouraged to affect their own insurance to cover all risks. The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the terms and conditions of contract enclosed in this manual.

### **EXHIBITION STAND RESERVATION**

Stands are allocated strictly on the basis of first come first served with reservations only being confirmed once payment of the deposit is received. Exhibitors may indicate their preferred stand locations, and a floor-plan of the Exhibition area is enclosed in addendum I for this purpose. The Organizers reserve the right to amend the exhibition floor plan at their sole discretion, if deemed necessary or desirable.

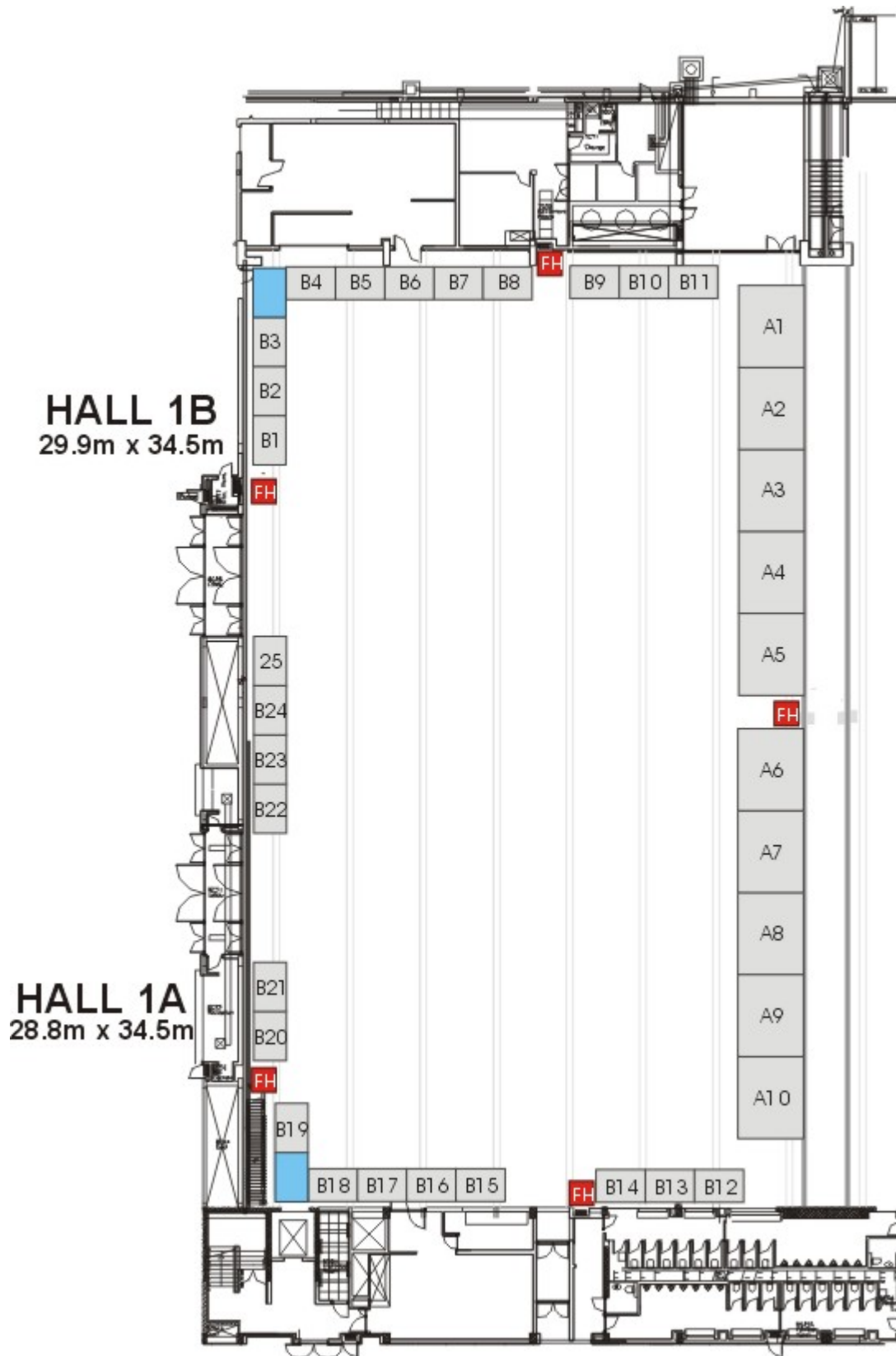
### **DEPOSITS**

Companies reserving stands prior to the 1st October 2004 are required to pay a 50% deposit of the stand cost. After that date, companies reserving stands are required to pay in full at the time of application. Stands can only be confirmed once appropriate payment has been received.

### **TERMS & CONDITIONS**

All Exhibitors are requested to read the terms and conditions of the contract set out in Addendum II of this manual and will be deemed to have accepted such terms and conditions upon completion of the Stand Application Form.

**ADDENDUM I**



## ADDENDUM II > TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The Exhibitor upon signature of the relevant application form by its duly authorized officer, agent, or employee enters into a contract with ACCESS 2004 Conference Organisers for exhibition space at the ACCESS 2004 Conference at THE CAPE TOWN INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION CENTRE. Reservation of the exhibition space by the Conference Organiser on behalf of the Exhibitor is conclusively presumed to be adequate consideration to bind the Exhibitor. No alleged representation, understandings, agreements, modifications, alterations, or additions not contained within the body of this written contract shall inure to the Exhibitor or be binding upon the Conference Organiser.

(1) **Exhibit Space Rental Fee**

These fees include shell scheme, plug point(s), electricity, spotlights, overall security service, general illumination, registration of delegates as is outlined in this manual, with accompanying meals and refreshments as indicated.

(2) **Payment Policy**

A deposit of 50% of the cost of the stand rental is payable upon booking (100% after 01 October 2004) and must accompany the stand booking form. The balance of the stand rental charge and payment of all additional services as requested on the miscellaneous service form is payable prior to 28 November 2004. A surcharge of 10% is payable in respect of all fees outstanding as from 15<sup>th</sup> November 2004 until 25<sup>th</sup> November 2004 after which a 20% surcharge is payable.

(3) **Purpose of Exhibition**

The contract for exhibition space shall be considered a binding contract between the two parties subject to the rules and regulations promulgated by the Conference Organiser pursuant to this Contract. The contracting Exhibitor and the Conference Organiser agree that the purpose of this exhibition is the professional education of persons attending and will conduct themselves accordingly. The Conference Organiser reserves the right to determine eligibility of any Exhibitor, product or service.

(4) **Exhibition Location and Time**

The ACCESS 2004 Conference, incorporating the Exhibition, will be held at the CAPE TOWN INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION CENTRE from 30 November – 02 December 2004. The Exhibition will be open according to the following schedule.

Tuesday 30 November 2004	07h30 – 21h00
Wednesday 1 December 2004	07h30 – 18h00
Thursday 2 December 2004	07h30 – 14h30

The Conference Organiser reserves the right to make changes in the exhibit hours; however, any such changes will be made as far in advance of the Exhibition as possible, and Exhibitors will be notified accordingly. During all hours the Exhibition is open, the Exhibitor must occupy its assigned exhibit space, and staff its exhibit with competent personnel. The Exhibitor shall not dismantle its exhibit or otherwise interfere with the orderly conduct of the Exhibition until it is finally closed.

(5) **Cancellation Policy**

The Exhibitor specifically recognizes and agrees that the Conference Organiser will sustain losses in the event the Exhibitor fails to provide timely notice of cancellation. Because these losses cannot be measured precisely, but which include inability to replace those cancelling late, advertising, credibility, redesigning of floor space, and others, the Exhibitor agrees upon the following late cancellation assessment schedule as being in the nature of liquidated damages, which schedule is designed specifically to compensate the Conference Organiser for its losses and not constitute a penalty should the Exhibitor fail to provide timely written notice of all or part of its assigned stand space.

(6) **Use of space**

The Exhibitor agrees not to assign, sublet, or share allocated space without the knowledge and prior written consent of the Conference Organiser. Exhibitors will not be permitted to display outside the confines of the assigned stand space in the Exhibition area. Printed advertising may be distributed by Exhibitors from within the confines of their own space inside the exhibit hall only. No exhibits, accessories, give-aways, promotional material, or any other goods bearing any name or form of advertising may be displayed or distributed within the registration

area, lobby, lounge or food service area of THE CAPE TOWN INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION CENTRE.

High equipment placed in stand areas must not exceed 3.0 metres, and must not restrict a clear view of neighbouring exhibits.

(7) **Security and Insurance**

The Exhibitor acknowledges the layout of the Exhibit area and the large numbers of people present in the Exhibition Halls make it impossible for adequate security to be provided to protect the Exhibitor's merchandise and other property. Accordingly, the Exhibitor assumes all risk of loss for Exhibitor's merchandise, fixtures, displays, and any other property of the Exhibitor located in the Exhibition Area, storage area, or any other area where access has been provided to Exhibitors by The Organisers where such loss results from theft, vandalism, or any other damage caused by any agent or employee of the Organisers or caused by any other person either authorized or not authorized to be present at the Exhibition-Hall.

Furthermore, the Exhibitor acknowledges that security guards and storage areas are provided by the Organisers merely as a service, and that the Organisers have made no representation regarding the adequacy of such security measures. The Organisers recommend that all Exhibitors/Sponsors consult their individual insurance representative to obtain appropriate insurance coverage. It is recommended that Exhibitors/Sponsors take precautionary measures of their own, such as arranging their own supplementary security facilities available through THE CAPE TOWN INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION CENTRE.

(8) **Liability**

Neither the Conference Organiser, its agents or representatives will be responsible for any injury, loss or damage that may occur to the Exhibitor or to the Exhibitor's employees or property prior to, during, or subsequent to the period covered by the contract, provided such injury, loss or damage is not caused by the negligent or wilful act of the aforementioned party. The Exhibitor, on signing the Stand Reservation Form, expressly releases the foregoing society, individuals, committees from any agreement to indemnify same against the Conference Organiser, its officers, directors, employees and agents. Exhibitors are advised to carry their own insurance. Exhibitors shall be responsible for any damage to carpet, shell scheme or electrical fittings and wiring.

(9) **Other Terms and Conditions**

The Exhibitor shall comply with all fire laws, electrical codes and all other rules, regulations, codes or statutes with respect to the installation, conduct and disassembly of its exhibit. The Exhibitors also shall comply with reasonable requests of the Conference Organiser and THE CAPE TOWN INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION CENTRE officials with respect to the installation, conduct and disassembly of its exhibit. The exhibit shall be conducted in a decorous manner in order not to be objectionable to other Exhibitors, the Conference Organiser, THE CAPE TOWN INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION CENTRE, Conference delegates or public. The Conference Organiser and THE CAPE TOWN INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION CENTRE reserves the right to close, remove or require changes in any exhibit, or to remove any of the Exhibitor's personnel, agents, representatives, independent contractors, invitees or guests who are deemed detrimental to the overall Conference, THE CAPE TOWN INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION CENTRE, other Exhibitors or public. The Exhibitor assumes full responsibility and liability for the actions of its agents, employees, or independent contractors, whether acting within or without the scope of their authority and agrees to save harmless the Conference Organiser and THE CAPE TOWN INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION CENTRE from responsibility or liability resulting directly or indirectly, or jointly from other causes that arise because of the actions or omissions of its agents, employees, or independent contractors whether acting within or without the scope of their authority. The Conference Organiser shall not be liable for failure to perform its obligations under this contract due to strikes, riots, acts of God, or any other cause beyond its control. In the event of such termination, the Exhibitor waives any and all damages and agrees that the Conference Organiser may, after deducting all the costs and expenses, including a reserve for claims, refund to the Exhibitor, and as for complete settlement and discharge of all Exhibitor's claims and demands, the pro-rata amount of all funds paid by Exhibitors. Anyone visiting, viewing or otherwise participating in the Exhibitor's exhibit is deemed to be the invitee or licensee of the Exhibitor rather than the invitee or licensee of the Conference Organiser.
